RN Survey Instrument and Response Frequencies for Nurses Employed in the Upper Peninsula Health Service Area¹

The Michigan Center for Nursing conducted a survey of licensed nurses in 2004 to collect data on their employment status, geographic distribution, age, plans to continue practicing, work setting, practice area, education, gender, and racial/ethnic background. This report presents the survey responses for registered nurses who entered an Upper Peninsula ZIP code for their primary place of employment. There were 238 surveys returned from RNs employed in the Upper Peninsula health service area, yielding a margin of error of ± 6.1 percent with 95 percent confidence for data for RNs in this health service area. Comparison of data for different health service areas is not recommended because the number of responses and corresponding margin of error varies among health service areas.

LPN Survey Instrument and Response Frequencies for Nurses Employed in the Upper Peninsula Health Service Area

The Michigan Center for Nursing conducted a survey of licensed nurses in 2004 to collect data on their employment status, geographic distribution, age, plans to continue practicing, work setting, practice area, education, gender, and racial/ethnic background. This report presents the survey responses for licensed practical nurses who entered an Upper Peninsula ZIP code for their primary place of employment. There were 88 surveys returned from LPNs employed in the Upper Peninsula health service area, yielding a margin of error of ± 10.2 percent with 95 percent confidence for data for LPNs in this health service area. Comparison of data for different health service areas is not recommended because the number of responses and corresponding margin of error varies among health service areas.

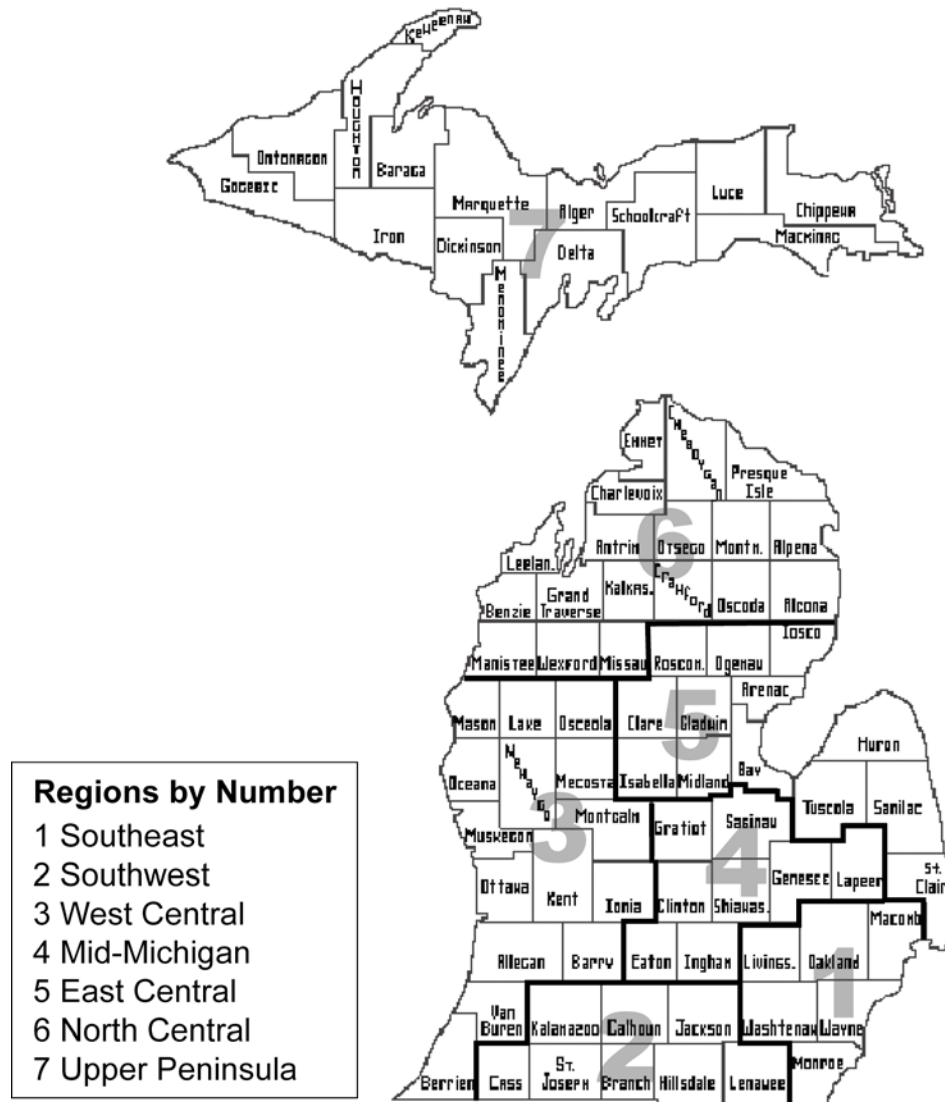
